Flinders Ranges Aboriginal studies field trip Sunday 30th - Friday 5th October 2007

Travel by air-conditioned bus to the ruggedly beautiful Flinders Ranges for six days during school holidays 2007.

Meet a range of Adnyamathanha ('people belonging to the rock country'). Cost includes travel from Adelaide, delicious healthy meals, bunk accommodation and Aboriginal guides.

Sunday and Thursday nights are in Quorn and nights between are at the Angorichina Tourist Village hostel, through Parachilna Gorge.

We'll be seeing sites of cultural and historic significance, with some walking (not strenuous) during the days while evening activities will include stories and maybe songs around the campfire. As well there will be practical activities for learning.

On Sunday, see and learn about the Colebrook Children's Home in Quorn where some of the 'stolen generation', including Adnyamathanha girl Faith Thomas (nee Coulthard) lived as a child before she went on to nurse and play cricket for Australia. Monday's stops include historical Kanyaka rock and ruins, Yourambulla Caves (rock art site), before travelling through Moralana Scenic Drive and on to Parachilna (where some of the film Rabbit Proof Fence was filmed) then on to Angorichina.

Learn from Adnyamathanha about bush food and medicine plants and try to find witchetty grubs in River Red Gum. Take part in a fun but serious activity to learn about Aboriginal history in South Australia since 1800. Walk along and through the creek bed to natural rock pools for a swim or paddle. Explore teaching resources, read, relax, maybe write a song or poem, create art, make a puppet to tell a story.

After leaving Angorichina on Thursday, view Wilpena Pound from Stokes Lookout, see ancient rock etchings in Sacred Canyon, stop at Wilpena for lunch and walk to Arkaroo Rock in the afternoon, a site which an archaeological dig found has been in use for over 6,000 years. At Quorn, learn about Aboriginal art symbolism and appropriate activities for teaching. Return to Adelaide by 5pm on Friday.

The bus will leave from the school car park on Harewood Avenue, Enfield, SA at 9am (meet at 8.30). Note that the program is subject to change depending on road conditions, some being impassable when wet. Mobile phones do not work in several locations. Suggestions for what to bring in a soft bag (not hard case) to be packed in a covered trailer include:

Pillow, sheet, sleeping bag or quilt, extra blanket maybe torch toiletries insect repellent and sunscreen towel and bathers (just in case) camera and film or charger thongs (for showering)

drink bottle backpack for day walking comfy walking shoes long sleeved shirts pen and notepaper sunglasses a 'formal' tie, hat, scarf or something similar for a fun 'formal' dinner night

clothing for possible hot, cold or wet weather hat and insect netting to fit (buy from camping shops) ear plugs (if snorers annoy you) quitar, harmonica if you're prepared to play them
