Growth Mindset: Personal Accountability and Reflection...

The Department of Education and Child Development are focusing on developing a Growth Mindset. Current research is indicating this is having an impact on student learning outcomes and supporting children in gaining employment in the future. For example two CEO's of Google recently spoke about how they employ people and these were their priorities:

- ◆ General Cognitive ability and how well they learn.
- ◆ Skills in being an emergent leader. Seeing a need for leadership, stepping in and then stepping out once others take on roles.
- ◆ Having a shared sense of curiosity, humility and wanting to impact on the world.
- ◆ Leadership in the field is considered but is not the greatest priority.

Through the learning process (for us as adults also) it is important to consider these questions:

- ◆ Did I work as hard as I could have?
- ◆ Did I set and maintain high standards for myself?
- ◆ Did I spend enough time to do quality work?
- ◆ Did I ask questions if I needed help?
- ◆ Did I make good use of available resources?
- ◆ Did I regulate my procrastination, distractions and temptations in order to complete my work?
- ◆ Is my work something for which I am proud—that I would proudly show to a large, global audience?
- ◆ Did I examine best practices for similar work?
- ◆ Did I review and re-review my work for possible errors?

Pop these questions up at home and conference with your child to support them to develop Growth Mindset learning dispositions.

Great Achievements at Goodwood

Adelaide Crows visit

On Tuesday 25th October we had a visit from the Adelaide Crows to present the Growing with Gratitude Program. Students learnt about the 5 Habits of Happiness, focussing on ways to improve emotional and physical wellbeing. The habits are;

- **An Attitude of Gratitude** – thinking about what you are grateful for
- **Random Acts of Kindness** – doing nice things for others
- **Positive Reflection** – thinking about positive experiences and looking forward to new experiences
- **Wellbeing Warriors** – being active, eating well and making time to relax e.g. reading or meditation
- **Operation Home Service** – regularly helping out around the home



The students enjoyed a fun quiz and prizes, entertaining videos and a Habits of Happiness relay against Claude the Crow and Chelsea Randall (a member of the new Crows Women's Team). It was a fantastic presentation with an excellent message for our students.

After the presentation our Preschool, Reception and Year 1 students participated in a footy clinic. The students rotated around three different activities and had lots of fun being active!



6M—Planting Experiments and Halloween Stories

On Monday 31st October 6M was divided in two, with half using the LEGO Story Starter sets to create spooky tales for Halloween, and the other half planting their seeds for their science experiments. After recess, the groups swapped. We put our experiments outside in the North Yard, and will tend to the plants every day and record observations in our science journals.

We have fourteen different experiments running; all are different. There are yellow beans, green beans, nasturtiums and silverbeet, and the variables are soil types, water, light, fertiliser, soil amount and seed density. We will certainly see some interesting results - let's see if the predictions come true.

We talked about the micro-organisms in potting mix and that you have to be careful not to breathe it in or eat it. Everyone was very excited to get rubber gloves. I think the trickiest part was cleaning up the mess at the end!

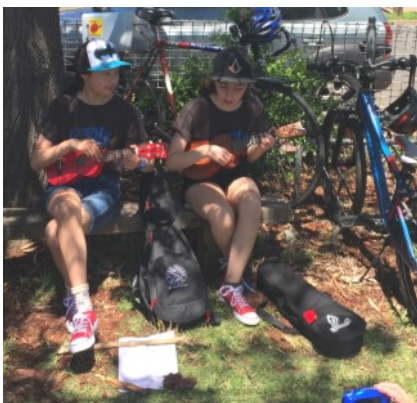
Opening the seeds - this group chose to test whether seeds grew better in more or less soil.

Watering the plants - we have to make sure we measure how much water we give each seed. If water is not our tested variable, we need to make sure we give exactly the same amount to each seed. This group is testing how much water is best to give a plant. Children were concocting a tale to scare the pants off everyone. The children had way too much fun in writing on the 31st!

"The Australian Orienteering Championships began near the Gold Coast with the Australian Sprint Championships on Saturday 24th September. Sunday featured the Australian Relay Championships, our team came 3rd in the men's 14 yr category.

From Monday to Thursday, the school's events were held in the Scenic Rim and SA came 3rd overall. I was most proud of my performance on Wednesday at Cotswold Bluff. The course was approximately 6 km long and featured 195m of climb. I came 15th out of 45 competitors, competing against 12 to 15-year-olds, and even one 16 year old! On the final weekend the Middle and Long Distance Champs were held in the granite country, on one of the most famous maps in Australia. I came first on both days in the Men's 12 year old category. I won by 1.5 seconds on Saturday and Sunday I had a lead of 29 seconds. Thank you." Toby

TERM 3 HIGHLIGHTS

The highlight of last term was the topic "Mangia Mangia".

Students learned the names of foods and constructed simple sentences such as "mi piace" (I like) and "non mi piace" (I don't like).

They were involved in various activities such as creating food plates and sentences describing the foods they liked. Through the use of their Italian language upper primary classes conducted surveys about foods students in their class like and why. From this data they produced graphs. Several classes also created their own Italian menus for breakfast, lunch and dinner which included pricing the meals.

Term 4... Un po'di drama!!!

This term students will be participating in some drama activities. They will be working with scripts in Italian, learning lines, understanding the language, organising costumes, making props and articulating the Italian words through use of drama skills. They will perform their plays in front of their peers where they will be given feedback on their performance. The Year 6/7 classes will share an Italian Master Chef presentation to impress their peers. To complete the year, the students will look briefly at Christmas in Italy.

Rainbow Lorikeets, part of the parrot family, breed mostly from September to January with two eggs being laid. Both parents feed their young and tend the nest with the female incubating the eggs. They are nectar feeding birds but also consume seeds, insects and fruit. They are mainly found in the northern and eastern areas of Australia.
