Only the other day when children were presenting their work from a homework task, the teacher focused on the ... "Where did you get stuck!!"
She was amazed how this simple question energised and engaged the children. It allowed the children to focus on the processes they went through to get to their final product. If a student's final product is looked at in isolation it may not demonstrate all the thinking, challenges and learning they worked through. Some children had started again several times but the sharing of the previous attempts provided the teacher with valuable information about their skills.
So when you sit down with your child to discuss their report it will be important to focus on the areas of growth as opportunities.
A couple of other interesting acronyms are: Remember END is not the end. E.N.D = Effort Never Dies.
If you get no as an answer NO means "Next Opportunity."

Urrbrae House Excursion


Urrbrae House was built in 1891 by Peter Waite, a wealthy pastoralist. Janet's and Bronwyn's classes visited so they could experience what life was like in 1892.


The children were put into three groups: servants, school children or guests of Mrs Waite.
"I didn't like being a servant because we made the food and we had to watch the others eat it. The guests got to eat sandwiches and sponge cake but we only got to eat scones, which was so unfair." (Sabrina)
"I was Fidelia the servant and I felt good about being a servant because even though my jobs were chores, I actually liked them." (Sienna)
"I was a guest at Urrbrae House but I would have preferred to be a servant or a child. It helped me think about the fact that back in those days you didn't get to choose. I learnt that how much money you had mattered when you were making friends. My wow moment was when the servants were serving the food and we weren't allowed to communicate with them." (Milly)

"I was a guest, but I would have wanted to be a school kid because you got to use ink." (Connor)
"Life in the 1890 s was really different to now. I was a school student called Nellie. In class we got to use ink and pen and learnt the song God Save the Queen." (Daniella)
"I thought the rule ladies first was awesome because all the men let the ladies go first." (Lily)
"It was hard. I just hated the phrase 'girls first'." (Hiranya)
